Pastoral Letter - October 2023 "Building Tomorrow, Together"

Every year, clergy and laity gather for the annual conference to worship, share reports, and support resolutions. One of the highlights of the conference is the memorial service for the pastors and their spouses who passed in the past year. One of the worship leaders read the name of the deceased, and those who have known them stand in love and respect, acknowledging how their witnesses influenced others to follow Christ. Interestingly, the worship leader also reads the names of the churches that closed that year, giving thanks to God for all the ministries to transform many lives in their communities.

The author of Ecclesiastes teaches us, "There is a season and a time for every matter under heaven, a time to be born and a time to die" (3:1-2). While it is understandable that everything has a beginning and end, it is sad that these churches closed their doors. Think about all those who gathered to worship there. All the babies who were baptized and celebrated. All the couples who were married. All the faithful ministries to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and welcome strangers. However, for these churches, their season has come to an end, with the hope of resurrection for a new church in a new form.

What about Aldersgate UMC? What season are we in today? We all know this pandemic has been very challenging for churches, let alone many changes in our lives. The most recent statistics show that 64% of churches in New England Conference have less than 25 people on Sunday mornings. Considering we reported 100 on Sundays last year, we can feel relatively good about ourselves. However, we want to be more than just feeling satisfied where we are. With the help of the BUILD initiative, we have been discerning where God is calling us in the future so that we can renew our love for God and find creative and relative ways to reach out to our community.

The name of our church is Aldersgate. It is named after the street where John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, had a conversion experience. After his failure in the missional work in Georgia, Wesley returned to England feeling depressed and defeated. On May 24, 1738, Wesley attended a Moravian meeting on Aldersgate Street. Suddenly, he felt his heart being warmed. He wrote, "I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation." He felt the love of God, who forgave his sins and saved him from death. He became a different person. His gospel was not limited to the church. He started going out to market, field, and even mind to preach.

I believe that this is why our church is nicknamed as "church with a warm heart." We want to be bold in proclaiming and living out the love of God, who may also warm the hearts of others. We do not wish our joy, peace, love, and generosity to be confined within the walls of our church. We want to actively share them with those who are looking to know who God is and what God has done for us through Christ. Isn't this why the chartering members of Aldersgate started our church back in 1963? They were warmed in their hearts to start a new church, sowing the seeds of God's love in our community.

Today, I led the graveside service for Jean Wetherell. Since it was raining, the family members gathered closer to each other under the canopy. I shared with them what a saint Jean was to Aldersgate UMC. I particularly remember her showing me pictures of her teaching little children in the Sunday school room. We are here today because of people like her felt warm in her heart and stepped up to build the church for the future. And we are here today. We discern, pray, and work together to build a community centered on the love of Christ, who touches us, heals us, challenges us, and sends us out to the world.

This is an exciting time for Aldersgate UMC because God may surprise us with God's plan that goes beyond our limited vision and plan. God may bring to us people we did not even think about reaching out and challenge us, "Will you love them and one another, just as I have loved you?" And we do this work and respond to the voice of God TOGETEHR, not alone.

Fall Schedule at Aldersgate

Worship services are offered at 8:30 and 10:45 on Sunday mornings. The 10:45 service is live-streamed and recorded for posting on the church web site shortly thereafter. 
All Are Welcome at Aldersgate


Here's a list of specific materials if you want to collect your own supplies:

- 29 medium (8mm 10mm) beads
- 36 seed (size #6 or #8) beads
- 1 cross or other pendant
- 2 crimp tubes (size 2 x 2)- **Kim will supply this**
- 20-24 inches of wire (49-strand, .019 or .018")- Kim will supply this

Tools Required- Melinda and Kim will have these available to use if you don't have your own.

- 1 pair of chain nose pliers
- 1 set of side (flush) wire cutters
