Pastoral Letter – January 2024 "What Makes Us New?"

A few weeks ago, I got a call from my health coach who works for my health insurance company. He said, "You set your goal at the beginning of this year that you would lose 5 pounds. Have you achieved your goal?" With guilt in my voice, I answered, "No, not really." I guess he did not want to discourage me, so he said cheerfully, "No worries. We can move this as your new goal for 2024. Would you agree?" I answered unconvincingly, "Yes, sure." Just like that, my old resolution that had been the same for the past years became the new resolution again. How about you? What is your resolution as we face 2024? Maybe some of us are thinking about eating healthier and exercising more regularly. Some of us wish to spend some more time with our family.

Whatever our resolution is for the new year, the Bible tells us that we can become new genuinely only through our relationship with God. In 2 Corinthians 5:17, Paul instructs us, "So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" John Wesley interprets, "One has new life, new sense, new faculties, new affections, new appetites, new ideas and conceptions. One's whole tenor of action and conversation is new, and one lives, as it were, in a new world." (Wesley's Explanatory Notes) In other words, it is not the new year that makes our lives new. Instead, Christ is the One who shines his light on us and makes our lives anew. As God's new creation, we live our lives in the order of God's new world – peace, love, justice, and joy.

As the new year approaches, it seems that people always search for something new. We are constantly exposed to TV commercials that promote diet and exercise. "Discover your new self today!" We are forced to look at ourselves and feel unhappy. "It is a time to get a new smartphone!" Although the salesperson tries to convince us why we need to update to a new phone, we do not recognize much difference between our new phone and the old phone. We are driven by the world to believe that we can become newer by buying more, exercising more, and working more. However, St. Augustine remarks insightfully in his *Confession*, "You stir man to take pleasure in praising you, because you have made us for yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." (I)

On Christmas Eve in 2011, I visited the state prison in New Hampshire to worship with the inmates. As a police chaplain, I had asked the prison chaplain to worship with them and assisted him with the music. The chaplain had told me, "Most of these inmates are young men in their 20s. Many of them do not have places to go so they often commit petty crimes. They come here so that they can get food, medical treatment and find shelter." While singing the carols, I felt like the wall between them and me collapsed as we sang the birth of Christ among us. After the sermon by the prison chaplain was over, one of the inmates raised his hand and said, "You mean, I can

really start my life new if I believe in Jesus?" The chaplain answered with conviction, "Yes, you can." The young man asked again, "Can we sing Amazing Grace?"

According to the Christian liturgical calendar, we have already started the new year with Advent and Christmas. It is not the new year January 1 that starts the new year for us. It is the coming of Christ that starts something new in us. If you are hungry spiritually, always yearning for something new, why don't we allow Christ to come into our heart and renew our relationship with God and our neighbors this year? Why don't we say yes to Christ who can change us, to do something wonderful through us? May God bless you, your family, our church, and God's world as we begin a new year in God.

## 2024 Budget Approved

Thanks to everyone who attended the Charge Conference on December 31st where the 2024 church budget was approved. The budget includes estimated income of \$352,904 and budgeted expenses of \$389,803, for a deficit of \$36,899. Our major source of income is from congregational pledging. There are 74 pledges, including 7 new pledges, totaling \$309,704. This is an increase of \$27,240 from 2023 to 2024. Thank you for your generous giving to Aldersgate's ministries! 

## **Aldersgate Holy Strollers**



Did you overeat during the holidays? Did you make a New Year's resolution to get more exercise? Come and hike with Aldersgate's Holy Strollers hiking group. The group hikes once a week on local conservation land in Bedford, Billerica, Carlisle, Chelmsford, Lowell and Westford. The hikes are usually 2.5 to 3 miles or about 1 to 1.5 hours on wooded trails which often have rocks and roots. We occasionally hike on paved paths, too, especially if there is snow on the ground. The group usually hikes on Thursday at 1:00 pm when the weather is cold or 9:00 am when the weather is hot. If the Thursday

weather forecast is rain or snow, the hike will shift to another weekday. On Sunday night or Monday morning an email is sent out to the group indicating the day, time and location of the hike. The email also includes a Google map link to the trailhead and a link to the trail map. A person from the group will meet at the church for anyone who wishes to carpool to the trailhead. You don't need to commit to every week, hike when you can. #### Pizza Time with College Students






## "Can Persons Who Forget God, Know God? Can one who forgets who Jesus is be a Christian disciple?

Dementia diseases represent a crisis of faith for many family members and congregations. Magnifying this crisis is the way people with dementia tend to be objectified by both medical and religious communities. They are recipients of treatment and projects for mission. Ministry is done to and for them rather than with them.

While acknowledging the devastation of dementia diseases, Ken Carder draws on his own experience as a caregiver, hospice chaplain, and pastoral practitioner to portray the gifts as well as the challenges accompanying dementia diseases. He confronts the deep personal and theological questions created by loving people with dementia diseases, demonstrating how living with dementia can be a means of growing in faith, wholeness, and ministry for the entire community of faith. He also reveals that authentic faith transcends intellectual beliefs, verbal affirmations, and prescribed practices. Carder asserts that the Judeo-Christian tradition offers a broader lens, defining personhood in relationship to God's story and humanity's participation in God's mighty acts of creation and new creation; thereby contributing to hope, community, and self-worth.

Pastors and congregations will be better equipped to minister with people affected by dementia, receiving their gifts and responding to their unique needs. They will learn how people with dementia contribute to the community and the church's life and mission, discovering practical ways those contributions can be identified, nurtured, and incorporated into the church's life and ministry."

"In this classic theological work, acclaimed theologian and religious leader Howard Thurman demonstrates how the gospel may be read as a manual of resistance for the poor and disenfranchised. Jesus is a partner in the pain of the oppressed, Thurman writes. The example of Jesus' life of suffering, pain, and overwhelming love offers a solution that ends our descent into moral nihilism. Although Jesus was scorned and forced to live outside society, he advocated a love of self and others that defeats fear and the hatred that destroys our souls and the world around us. Jesus and the Disinherited reaches past anger and distrust toward a vision of unity.

Howard Thurman (1900–1981) was the first black dean of Marsh Chapel at Boston University and cofounder of the Church for the Fellowship of All Peoples in San Francisco, California, the first interracially copastored church in America. Life magazine called him one of the great preachers of the 20th century, and Thurman was a spiritual adviser to Martin Luther King Jr."


