
2024 Budget Approved

Thanks to everyone who attended the Charge Conference on 12/31where the 2024 church budget was approved. The budget includes estimated income of \$351,904 and budgeted expenses of \$389,803, for a deficit of about \$37,900. The pledges, which are our major source of income, increased by about \$27,000 for 2023 to 2024 for a total of \$310,500. There are 74 pledges, including 7 new pledges! Thank you for your generous giving to Aldersgate's ministries! The Finance committee is looking for ways to reduce the budget deficit. They are getting 1,500 NJ National Guards in Syria and Iraq. Sounds like they're going to Fort Bliss first and then headed over. "Only things I'd ask for is" **coffee creamer** (not refrigerated type), and protein bars (it is hard to get enough protein for their workouts), and fruit cups or dried fruit.
