Pastor's Column

Dear Siblings in Christ,

As we move into the month of September and make our way closer to the official beginning of Fall, I've been thinking a lot recently about all of the stories that are being gathered and told this time of year: stories of summer vacations or time away that kids will tell their friends about when they go back to school; the stories that co-workers will share about their families as they tell about the memories they made; catch-up stories that will update a close friend on the latest chapter of something they've been following together step-by-step. I was really taken in by a story I heard in an interview this morning on NPR as I was taking my kids to school. Author Arundhati Roy was being interviewed about her recent memoir (Mother Mary Comes to Me) and was talking about the mixture of feelings she carries about her own mother (Mary Roy), who was a famous and very influential advocate for women's rights in India throughout her life and yet also quite severe and emotionally distant in her home life. Arundhati spoke about her great admiration, respect, and gratitude for her mother's work and reflected aloud on what a gift it has been to her, even while she aches for the loss of some of the more personal gifts that she always wanted from her mother. She said at one point that she wrote this memoir because she wanted to try and get ahold of the shape that that experience and mixture of feelings left her in—in many ways, she said, that is the shape (for good or ill) that she has had to learn how to carry forward in her life. At the end, she said a word of thanks "to the God of striped and speckled things" for the gift of her mother and her experiences and for the wisdom and insight her reflection times has given her.

I'm struck by the way she put that: that relationship and that experience left her in a shape of some kind that she has had to learn to live her life in. Isn't that true of us all? The stories we learn about ourselves have shaped the teller and the telling. They fashion our hearts in sometimes contorted, sometimes contradictory ways and we somehow have to hold ourselves before God and one another in those shapes and live forward from there. I think it may be for this reason, above all others, that the Psalms are near and dear to me. In Psalms, we hear all kinds of voices in all kinds of stations of life—voices that are fearful, angry, broken, scarred, joyful, vengeful, sad, victorious, and voices that, very often, join their story with those emotions so that we can hear their truth in full and join in with them wherever we may be. Psalms, in that way, reminds us that there is an access-point to God wherever we may be, and somehow, at that access point, its words become not only our words to God, but God's word to us. What a grace it is, Psalms reminds us, that God finds us and moves ahead with us whatever shape life has left us in, That God is also the "God of striped and speckled things." Friends, I intend to usher us into the Fall on that theme and with the Psalms as our guide, especially here in the month of September. I will

be starting a new sermon series this coming Sunday entitled "I Will Call Upon the Lord" and it is my hope and prayer that it might offer us all an opportunity to look closely at the shape we're in as we start to plan our way forward. It is an honor to be your pastor. I look forward to hearing your stories and getting to know you better as we move ahead on our journey together.

Sermon Series in September: "I Will Call Upon the Lord"

How do we meet God where we are (rather than from where we wish we were)? If there is one thing that the book of Psalms is full of, it's different voices finding themselves and finding their way to God from wherever they are whether they be strained, anxious, fearful, or joyful. Finding ourselves before God is how we find our footing, notice where we are and what we've been carrying, and ultimately bring the fullness of ourselves into step with where God would take us. In this new series, let us listen in a new way to the voices of the Psalmists as they reveal where God is already standing with us right where we are.





Thursday Morning Bible Study Begins This Week!

The Thursday morning Bible study returns this Thursday, Sept 11 at 10 am in the Concord Room or on Zoom to catch up with one another after the summer break. Next week, September 18, led by Pastor John, the class will continue their study of Words of Life by Adam Hamilton, picking up at Chapter VII: Faithfulness in an Age of Porn. In this book of Scripture and inspiration, Adam brings modern eyes to the most important set of ethics in history, the Ten Commandments. He considers the commandments in their historical context, considering the meaning of each commandment in Hebrew, unpacking how Jesus reinterpreted them, and showing how every thou-shalt-not was intended to point to a lifegiving "thou shalt." He also explores how the latest research in science and psychology illuminates these commandments, rightly understood, as a way of ordering one's life beautifully in the present day. 
