# Fall Plans for Aldersgate!

**Worship services** are offered at 8:30 and 10:45 am. The 10:45 service is live-streamed and recorded for posting on the church web site shortly thereafter.

**Coffee Hour** is offered in the Fellowship Hall between the services.

**Church School classes** are offered in-person, downstairs between the services, from 9:30 to 10:30 am. Classes include for PreK - 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, 3<sup>rd</sup> - 5th grade, 6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> grade, and 9<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

**Adult Education** meets in the Concord Room and via Zoom each Sunday at 9:45 am. Early Bird meets via Zoom each Tuesday at 10:00 am. The Thursday Morning Bible study meets each Thursday, at 10:00 am in the Concord Room and via Zoom. Each of the three opportunities has a different study and vibe. 


## Early Bird Bible Study is back on 9/16.

## Thursday Morning Bible Study Begins This Week!

The Thursday morning Bible study returns this Thursday, Sept 18 at 10 am in the Concord Room or on Zoom led by Pastor John. The class will continue their study of *Words of Life* by Adam Hamilton, picking up at Chapter VII: Faithfulness in an Age of Porn. In this book of Scripture and inspiration, Adam brings modern eyes to the most important set of ethics in history, the Ten Commandments. He considers the commandments in their historical context, considering the meaning of each commandment in Hebrew, unpacking how Jesus reinterpreted them, and showing how every thou-shalt-not was intended to point to a life-giving "thou shalt." He also explores how the latest research in science and psychology



illuminates these commandments, rightly understood, as a way of ordering one's life beautifully in the present day. You can find the book at any online retailer.
