#### Pastor's Column

Dear Siblings in Christ,

There is a book on my office bookshelf that catches my eye every so often and whose title always seems to give me pause. The book is called *Divine Economy* and its author is a United Methodist theologian and ethicist, Stephen Long, whom I have become acquainted with and whose writings and postings I have been following for a number of years now. When I read it a few years ago I remember thinking that it was brilliant and convicting—it's pages are full of my underlinings and notes—but also very slow going for the non-economist, like me. Ever since, whenever it catches my eye, though, I find myself thinking something like, "hmmm, 'divine economy'. I wonder what that really means? I wonder what that would really look like today?"

We're entering into our stewardship season this month at AUMC and I wonder if this isn't a timely opportunity for us, as well, to think through our place within God's economy. The Bible says quite a lot about God's economy. When the Israelites were instructed in the Torah about how they should live their lives with one another once they entered the land, they were told not to steal or covet one another's property, that they should look after and provide for the widow, the orphan, and the resident alien, that every so often there should be a release from crushing debt, a tithe to support the temple, and a portion of the fall harvest to feed the poor. When God stepped into human life in Christ, he spent most of his time in ministry meeting the needs of the poor, feeding the hungry, and healing infirmities and, on more than one occasion, he called those who followed him to participate in what he was doing. When the disciples asked Jesus how they might provide for the great multitude gathered to meet him by the Sea of Galilee, he told them, "You give them something to eat" (Mark 6:37); when Zacchaeus climbed down the Sycamore tree with a new heart and a new perspective, Jesus was quick to let him know that he was also hosting for dinner; and he was keen to point out the hidden spectacle of a poor, old widow offering the temple treasury her very last mite. He might just as well have said, "everyone just look at that woman and the way she faithfully empowers God's economy!"

Empowering God's economy—I wonder if that's not the real subject below the surface when we come around to stewardship season, when we sit down and workout our household budgets, when we look at our schedules and figure out how we want to make use of our time, when we consider how we want to become more involved and engaged with the church in mission. How might I live so that my life empowers God's economy? How might I live and arrange my life to step into what God is doing? That may take some thought. In truth, we live within a number of competing economies and each one empowers something to go on existing. My Netflix subscription empowers Netflix to continue existing for another month. My gym membership allows Choice Fitness to pay its employees and pay their light bill. What are the

things that God needs me to empower? This October, I'd like to invite us all into a season where we revisit together not just our support of the church but, more broadly, the call on our lives to empower God's economy in the world where we live. I'd like to ask you to pray about that in the next month leading up to consecration Sunday on October 26: where, God, do you need to use the things that I have to offer? Where, God, do you need me to empower the things you need to thrive? How are you calling me to participate in the things that you want to accomplish? What are the things that you need from me to help your vision for the world succeed? May God Bless Your Hearts!



#### Join Us! Adult Sunday School Today





#### **Discerning Our Response to Christian Nationalism**

At the New England Annual Conference this past June, a resolution was approved regarding Christian Nationalism. Your Church Council is discerning to understand how Aldersgate should respond to our Conference's call to resist Christian Nationalism. What questions and thoughts do you have on this subject? We invite you to share what is on your mind on this topic with Pastor John, Pastor Maylis, our Lay Leader Jim Ortolf, or our Council Chair, Peter Smyton.

The resolution reads, in part: "WHEREAS Christian Nationalism is a cultural framework and political ideology that merges an exclusionary form of Christian supremacist identity with a particular American identity, distorting both the Christian faith and the United States Constitution by appropriating Christian language and imagery to intertwine Christianity with political and civic life, amass political power, and often serve as a vehicle for white supremacy and racial subjugation (General Board of Church and Society, Faith and Facts: Christian Nationalism); . . .

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that The New England Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church unequivocally rejects and denounces Christian Nationalism in all its forms as a distortion and a misuse of the Christian faith;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New England Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church, in all its expressions, commits to educating its members, clergy, and congregations on the societal and spiritual dangers of Christian Nationalism, equipping them to recognize, address, and resist it through theological reflection, meaningful dialogue, and faithful action.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the New England Annual Conference will work to develop and distribute resources that help pastors and congregations faithfully oppose Christian Nationalism while fostering a Christianity rooted in justice, inclusion, and love;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New England Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church will commit to ongoing discernment, confession, and repentance for any complicity in Christian Nationalism, especially where it has shaped government policy, church governance, or public discourse, striving to ensure that our witness remains true to the gospel's call to love, justice, and liberation."


This special evening will include a catered sit-down dinner, music, and the chance to come together in support of our mission to build safe, affordable homes for families in need. Tickets are on sale now!
