## 2026 Church Budget to be presented at Church Conference

The Finance Committee recently developed and will present a recommended 2026 church budget at the Church Conference being held this Sunday evening, November 30, at 7:00 pm. The budget includes a 3% increase on all staff salaries. The recommended budget is, for the sixth year in a row, a deficit budget, with estimated expenses exceeding expected income by more than \$37,600. That is a deficit of 9.2%. We are decreasing the budget deficit somewhat by applying the dwindling unallocated funds that we received due to some very generous unexpected donations during the pandemic. This year, in 2025, we started the year with an even bigger deficit and benefited from the generosity of the congregation to substantially decrease this year's deficit. Please pray for continued wise stewardship in managing our financial resources to further Aldersgate's ministry!


## **Sunday Morning Class Adult Education News**

# Yambasu Agriculture Initiative

In Africa, UMC Global Ministries is expanding the **Yambasu Agriculture Initiative** to help communities improve their food security through agricultural training and capacity building.

Named for the late Bishop John K. Yambasu of Sierra Leone, the Yambasu Agriculture Initiative works with United Methodist annual conferences and episcopal areas in Africa to lead agricultural projects that build self-sustaining communities.

#### **Project Examples**

- · expanded growth of crops such as maize, cassava and rice
- · cultivating seed projects to expand future crop output
- honey and secondary product sales
- poultry, rabbit and piggery projects, among others
